SPRING HERB COLLECTION



Basil Romanesco

Basil is one of the most popular herbs in any garden. This wide leaved green selection is fusarium resistant and reaches a height of 24 inches. The white flowers attract bees and other pollinators like crazy. Consider planting basil in your vegetable garden to attract native pollinators.



Chives Fine Leaved

Chives bear attractive lilac pink flowers in late summer. After this perennial flowers, cut back to 2 to 3 inches tall and promote secondary growth. This allows you to have two harvests of this tasty allium. Try in sauces and flavored vinegars for a change of pace. All home chefs love to cook with chives sweet mild onion flavor.



Thyme English

Plant thyme in a sunny location. This sturdy perennial grows to about 6 inches tall and has lovely lavender flowers in mid summer. English thyme is valued for its culinary uses. Consider drying small bunches and storing for winter cooking.



Oregano Greek

Also know as *Origanum heracleoticum*. Prized for its spicy pleasant flavor. Like most other oregano varieties, which are perennials, they like full sunny locations and good drainage. Do not over water, and consider planting in a patio container.



Parsley Giant of Italy

Parsley is a true biennial, but typically grown as an annual. Most flat parsley varieties have the best flavor and cooking uses. Plants typically reach about 12 inches high and are great in mixed herb and edible flower plantings.



Herb Cilantro

Cilantro refers to the fresh leafy portion of this annual herb. Coriander typically refers to the seed, which is used as a spice. Plant this fast growing annual herb from seed and enjoy both the herb and the spice in you cooking. Typical plants usually reach 20 to 22 inches when flowering.



Herb Dill Fern Leaf

AAS winner from 1992. Dwarf dill that only reaches 15 to 18 inches. The fern leaf frilly leaves are quite attractive, as an ornamental as well as an edible. The entire dill plant is useable as a herb, from the seeds, to the leaves and flower stalks. Plant Fern Leaf Dill and Pick a Bushel together for a summer of All American Selection pickle making.



Herb Basil Siam Queen

AAS winner from 1997. Can be used for an ornamental bedding plant as well as a herb. Siam Queen has a sweet and spicy Thai basil flavor. Basil is a must in any kitchen garden. Plan on growing Siam Queen again this summer.
